# Resettling Afghan refugees

To help address the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, the federal government has committed to resettling at least 40,000 vulnerable Afghan refugees.



# **Resettling Afghan refugees**



#### So far, Canada has welcomed more than 8,580 Afghan nationals since August 2021. The pace of arrivals continues to increase in 2022.

#### Afghan refugees in Canada

- They are vulnerable and have some critical needs when they arrive
- Very few Afghan refugees can speak French
- Some interesting data is available

# The approach: a collective effort

- Critical importance of partners
- Over 100 organizations have mobilized thousands of volunteers
- Sponsorship of refugees: important in our response to this crisis



#### Refugee Resettlement Program

- IRCC is funding service providers in 39 communities across the country, outside Quebec
- On January 17, 2022, Minister Fraser announced an investment of over \$35 million
